PURPOSE

Brussels.

The aim of security sector reform (SSR) is to meet the security needs of women, men, girls and boys through an effective, affordable, accountable and transparent security sector governed by democratic principles.

The ESDC Basic Course on SSR aims to enhance individual knowledge and capacities to engage in implementation of the EU-wide strategic framework on SSR and related policy and the integrated approach to external conflicts and crisis. The course aspires to strengthen networking and cooperation between personnel and institutions in this field of work.

COURSE CONTENT

Participants will acquire an understanding of SSR, how it has evolved and been implemented and links to other concepts. Experts and experienced practitioners will share theory and practical cases. The course will explore the need for national ownership, gender-responsiveness and political commitment. EU policy and practice form the foundation of the course. It will include speakers from different EU institutions to share information on the variety of efforts on policy, development cooperation, civilian and military engagement. Emerging challenges and opportunities will be discussed.

After this course, participants will be able to:

- Explain the concept of SSR, its key elements, the variety of actors involved and relevant policy frameworks;
- Identify key lessons learnt and from practical SSR experiences;
- Analyse the role and contribution of the EU in the overall SSR process of a host country;
- Describe the importance of an integrated approach to promote effective and coherent EU SSR support;
- Apply key EU SSR policy and guidance documents during the planning and/or implementation of EU engagement;
- Advocate for the importance of gender-responsive SSR and identify entrypoints for gender mainstreaming when analyzing and conducting SSR.

METHODOLOGY

The course uses an interactive and learner-centred approach which encourages participants to engage in their learning processes, aims to accommodate different learning styles and provides opportunities for participants to reflect on their own learning.

COURSE STRUCTURE

The participants will attain or refresh basic knowledge through self-paced e-learning modules before meeting in-person for a three-day active engagement on the substance. Successful completion of the e-learning and full attendance in the residential phase is mandatory to receive the certificate. Participants will receive a follow-up message six months after the course for an opportunity to reflect on learning.

TARGET GROUP

This course will be of specific value for personnel in the EEAS, the Commission (including DG INTPA, DG NEAR) and Member States' delegates to relevant Council Working groups. It is also open for applications from other personnel with a specific interest in SSR.

APPLICATION

Interested institutions are encouraged to nominate applicants through the designated national nominator via the ESDC registration system ENLIST at https://esdc.europa.eu/enlist/login. Deadline for nomination is 3 November, 2024. Selected candidates will then be contacted. Upon confirmation of attendance, participants will gain access to the ILIAS e-learning system.
