





Invitation to the Capability Planning and Development Course (Activity Number 25-26/8/1)

Brussels, 22-26 September 2025

The European Union Military Staff (EUMS) with the cooperation of the European Defence Agency (EDA) has the honour to organise, under the aegis of the European Security and Defence College (ESDC), the *Capability Planning and Development Course,* in Brussels from 22 to 26 September 2025.

Over the past years, there have been major changes in the field of EU capability planning and development triggered by political documents such as EU Global Strategy (EUGS) and the Strategic Compass. In 2016, the EUGS created momentum in the field of security and defence: new capability planning and development processes were initiated and some existing ones were improved. For example, since 2018 the Headline Goal Process has been aligned with the NATO Defence Planning Process in terms of timelines and taxonomy. Also, new defence initiatives were established such as Permanent Structured Cooperation (PESCO), the Coordinated Annual Review on Defence (CARD) and the European Defence Fund (EDF). Furthermore, the importance of increasing the defence readiness recalled in the Strategic Compass has been developed by the European Defence Industrial Strategy (EDIS).

Most recently, the Joint White Paper for European Defence Readiness 2030, published in March 2025, recognises the shifting of the geopolitical dynamics and new challenges. In response, it has set ambitious objectives for bolstering EU military capabilities and developing agile, interoperable, technologically advanced, and resilient forces capable of defending the European security order. It emphasises the importance of capability planning and development at an EU level proposing specific measures to close critical capability gaps, build a strong defence industrial base whilst stepping up support to Ukraine.

Thus, the overarching course objective is to familiarise personnel from EU Member States and institutions with the EU Capability Development Planning System including the Headline Goal Process.

The ESDC is committed to an inclusive, diverse, gender-sensitive and anti-discriminatory environment. This is why we encourage you to nominate candidates from groups, which are likely to be under-represented.

We are very pleased to invite you to nominate appropriate candidates to participate in this ESDC training activity. For further information, please refer to the draft programme and administrative instructions in the annexes.

Capability Planning and Development Course

Administrative Information

Target audience: The participants, from relevant ministries of EU Member States, institutions, bodies, and agencies, should preferably have basic knowledge of CSDP and some experience in the field of capability planning and development.

How to apply: Applications should be made via the ESDC secure internet system ENLIST, by designated nominators, at https://esdc.europa.eu/enlist/login, no later than **22 August 2025**. A list of relevant ENLIST nominators can be found on the ESDC website at https://esdc.europa.eu/nominators/. Be sure that you have contacted your respective nominator well in time before that deadline.

Registration: Registration will not be final until confirmed by the ESDC Secretariat AND upon completion of the requested personal data in ENLIST by the confirmed participants.

Number of seats: A maximum of 30 participants is envisaged. Typically, one seat will be allocated to each Member State. However, depending on the total number of requests, one additional seat could be allocated.

Venue: The venue will be in the proximity of the Schuman European Quarter, which is where the main EU institutions are located. More precise details will be given in due time.

Language: The working language will be English, without translation.

Time: The course starts on Monday at 9:00 and ends on the Friday at 12:00.

E-learning: The residential part of the course will be preceded by mandatory eLearning modules which must be completed before the residential part of the course starts; detailed information about this will be shared with course participants at a later stage.

Attendance: Attendance is mandatory on all days. Participants will receive the ESDC certificate on the last day of course only if they have completed the full course, including the eLearning modules.

Inclusivity: The ESDC strives for a **gender-sensitive and inclusive environment** in all its courses, activities and day-to-day work. Only in an inclusive environment can all people, and therefore the ESDC and its partners, reach their true potential. We do not and will not discriminate on the basis of race, colour, religion, gender, gender expression, age, national origin, disability, marital status, or sexual orientation in any of our activities or operations.







The ESDC and the training institutions will not tolerate any conduct that violates these values.

Transportation: The course organisers do not provide any transportation.

The Schuman European Quarter and Brussels Airport (Zaventem) are connected by local train (to Schuman or Luxembourg station, about 10-15 minutes ride), bus (line number 12, stopping at e.g. Schuman station or at Trône/Troon, about 25 minutes ride). Taxis fares between the airport and the centre are €50 on average (can be higher late at night or during periods of heavy congestion).

Costs: Sending authorities will cover all costs for travelling, accommodation, and catering (including breakfast) for participants.

Dress code: Military: daily office uniform; Civilian: business casual

Liabilities and Insurance: In case of medical emergencies, participants' medical insurance, provided by the sending country / organisations must cover all costs. The organiser does not provide health or accident insurances for participants.
