1. Dates and location

- **2.** <u>Seats & nominations</u>: a maximum of 30 participants is envisaged. Typically, one seat per Member State/ Institutions will be allocated. However, depending on the total number of requests, one additional seat could be allocated.
- **3. Application**: applications from the EU Member States and EU bodies are to be sent via email to **int.law@bmlv.gv.at**, by designated nominators, no later than **Friday**, **25 October 2024**. A list with relevant ENLIST nominators can be retrieved from the ESDC website at https://esdc.europa.eu/nominators/.

The application should indicate: the full name of the candidate (as in official documents used for accessing course venue), personal e-mail address (functional mailboxes will not be accepted), nationality, passport number, the validity of the passport, date of birth, institution, reason how this course benefits the applicant.

Please use the designated application form! A scanned copy of the application form should be sent via email (**int.law@bmlv.gv.at**). Given the limited number of places available, the Austrian MoD will finalize the selection of applicants and inform them by the end of October of 2024.

4. Attendance: participants' attendance during the course is mandatory on all days. Participants who have completed the full course of three modules, including the e-learning modules, will receive a ESDC certificate.

Please be aware that the **dress code** for the **military personnel** is **class-A uniform** for the **first and second Module** and **field uniform** for the **third Module**. **Civilian** participants are requested to **dress adequately**.

E-learning: the course consists of an eLearning part to be completed on the ESDC eLearning platform ILIAS before each module starts. Details on the e learning will be provided in due time to all registered participants.

6. Course materials

English-language material for the course, including all relevant treaty instruments in hard copy, will be provided to all participants. A working library with selected reading materials on relevant aspects of International Law will also be available for the participants' use.

7. Costs, accommodation and subsistence

There will be no **participation fee** for the entire course because of new budgetary and legal regulations.

Please note that we have arranged a pre-reservation for the accommodation in Vienna; each participant has to take care of the reservation on his own. To be able to assign your reservation, the subject "11. Internationaler Rechtsberaterlehrgang 2024" must be indicated.

The **costs** for a single room are approximately **50.00 EUR** per night. Breakfast and lunch will also be available at own expenses. The costs for breakfast and lunch are approximately 15.00 EUR per day, excluding drinks. There is also a cafeteria available. Dinner is at own arrangement.

8. Travel arrangements and transport

Participants are expected to make their **own travel arrangements** considering that the course starts on Monday, 08.30 am, and lasts until Friday, 16.00 pm. Participants from abroad are generally expected to arrive on Sunday prior to the course start.

For **Module I** it will <u>unfortunately</u> **not** be possible to provide **transport** from Vienna City Airport to the accommodation. Participants will receive information how to get to the *Wohnheim Breitensee* using Vienna's public transportation system.

For **Module II** there will be a **bus transport** available from the Vienna International Airport to the course facility and back.
