- capacity-building sessions to enhance strategic planning and decision-making skills.
- case studies with real-world examples to foster interactive discussion on successful cyber defence initiatives.

CEIDA is fully acquainted with research on cybersecurity and artificial intelligence. Building on its 40+ years of working with Italian governmental institutions, it focuses on developing and enhancing expertise, know-how and capabilities that can foster resilient strategies to secure our digital future.

### Course administrative instructions

## ‘Cyberdiplomacy Advanced Course’

(ESDC activity number 24-25/207.b/2)

**18 – 20 June 2025 (fully residential) at CEIDA, Rome, Italy**

**Date:** 18 to 20 June 2025 in fully residential format.

**Maximum number of participants:** 50.

**Location:** Italy, Rome – CEIDA Campus - Via Palestro, 24

**Language:** English (without translation or interpretation).

**Target audience:** the course is open to mid-ranking to senior officials (civilian and military) from EU Member States/EU institutions, bodies and agencies.

**How to apply:** applications from **EU Member States and institutions** are to be filled in by the national ENLIST nominators through the ESDC secure registration system using the following link <https://esdc.europa.eu/enlist/login>, **no later than 21 May 2025**. A list of relevant ENLIST nominators can be found on the ESDC website here: <https://esdc.europa.eu/nominators/>.

**Registration:** registration will not be final until confirmed by the ESDC Secretariat. When the participants’ list is finalised, the course administrators will contact the selected participants and provide detailed information about the course.

**Please do not book flights and accommodation before receiving the confirmation message.**

**Medical emergency:** costs should be covered by the participants’ medical insurance provided by the sending country/organisation. The organiser will not provide health or accident insurance for participants.

**Dress code:** business attire for all participants, both civilians and military personnel.

**Cost:** the course is free of charge. The sending authorities will cover all costs for travel and accommodation. It is recommended that participants arrive at Rome International Airport by Tuesday 17 June 2025 at the latest. Participants should arrange their own travel and accommodation. Further information will be sent to participants following registration.

**E-learning:** the course begins with an online (asynchronous) e-learning part on the ESDC's e-learning platform (ILIAS LMS), which needs to have been completed before the residential part begins. Both parts are compulsory. Detailed information will be shared with the selected participants.

**Supporting services:** all administrative information, programmes and material will be made available to the selected participants through the ESDC's e-learning platform (ILIAS LMS).

**Attendance:** mandatory for all course days. A certificate will be awarded to those course participants who have completed the full course, including the mandatory e-learning modules.
