Invitation to the course on:

Cybersecurity and International Law

(ESDC activity number 24-25/216/1)

From 10 to 12 February 2025 – residential format, Brussels

Lodz Cyber Hub, a research centre representing the University of Lodz, Poland, under the auspices of the **European Security and Defence College (ESDC)** is organising a full residential course on cybersecurity and international law from 10 to 12 February 2025 in Brussels. This course is a non-specialised cyber course at awareness level. It is linked to the strategic objectives of Pillar 3 of **the EU's Cybersecurity Strategy for the Digital Decade**¹, reflects the priority on cyber within the **EU's Strategic Compass**² and supports the **European Cybersecurity Skills Framework (ECSF)** of ENISA³ 'Cyber Legal, Policy and Compliance Officer' profile.

This course offers a practical approach to the application of international law in cyberspace, focusing on current geopolitical challenges and pragmatic solutions. It includes a review of international legal instruments addressing current policies, covering topics such as state responsibility, cybersecurity due diligence, the peaceful settlement of cyber disputes, proportional countermeasures, transboundary data flows – including personal data, Big Data, and GDPR – intermediary liability, platform regulation and the human rights implications of algorithmic design and artificial intelligence.

This course will also enable participants to exchange their views and share best practices on cyber-related topics while improving their knowledge, skills, and competencies. By the end of this course, participants will possess the practical knowledge and skills necessary to address contemporary international law issues in cyberspace.

Part of the ESDC's EAB.Cyber/Cyber Education Training Exercise and Evaluation (ETEE) platform, this course is designed for mid-level to senior officials (civilian and military) dealing with cybersecurity issues, and is open to individuals from EU Member States, EU institutions, EU bodies and agencies, candidate countries, third countries, and international and regional organisations.

The ESDC is committed to an inclusive, gender-sensitive and discrimination-free environment. Only in an inclusive environment can all people, and therefore the ESDC and its partners, realise their true potential. We therefore particularly encourage applicants from under-represented groups to apply.

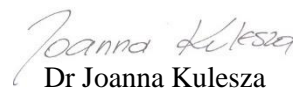
The course is scheduled to take place from **10 to 12 February 2025** in a residential format in Brussels.

Course administrative instructions

Course: Cybersecurity and International Law

Brussels, 10 to 12 February 2025 (fully residential)

This ESDC course supports the ‘Cyber Legal, Policy and Compliance Officer’ profile of the European Cybersecurity Skills Framework (ECSF) of ENISA

The course will be held in English from **10 to 12 February 2025** in **fully residential format in Brussels, Belgium**, with sufficient accommodation for a **maximum of 25 participants**.

Target audience: The course is open to mid-ranking to senior officials (civilian and military) dealing with cyber security issues and who are from EU Member States/EU institutions bodies and agencies, candidate countries, third countries and international and regional organisations.

How to apply:

- Applications from the **EU Member States and institutions** are to be filled in by the national ENLIST nominators via the ESDC secure registration system via the following link <https://esdc.europa.eu/enlist/login>, **no later than 15 January 2025**. A list of relevant ENLIST nominators can be retrieved from the ESDC website at <https://esdc.europa.eu/nominators/>.
- Applications from **non-EU States** have to be identified by their **national authorities** and transmitted to Mr Giuseppe Zuffanti: giuseppe.zuffanti@eeas.europa.eu.

Registration: Registration will not be final until confirmed by the ESDC Secretariat. When the participants’ list is finalised, the course administrators will contact the selected participants and provide detailed information on the course.

Please do not book flights and accommodation before receiving the confirmation message.

Medical emergency: Costs should be covered by the participants’ medical insurance provided by the sending country/organisation. The organiser will not provide health or accident insurance for participants.

Number of participants: The course capacity is 25 participants.

Language: The working language is English, without translation or interpretation.

Dates: The course starts on Monday 10 February 2025 and ends on Wednesday 12 February 2025. The draft agenda is attached as Annex B.

Dress code: business attire for all participants, including civilians and military personnel.

Cost: The course is free of charge. The sending authorities will cover all costs for travel and accommodation. It is recommended that participants arrive at Brussels International Airport by Sunday 9 February 2025 at the latest. Participants should arrange their own travel and accommodation. Further information will be sent to participants following registration.

E-learning: The course begins with an online (asynchronous) e-learning part on the ESDC’s e-learning platform (ILIAS LMS), which needs to have been completed before the residential part begins. Both parts are compulsory. Detailed information will be shared with the selected participants.

Supporting services: All administrative information, programmes and material will be made available to the selected participants through the ESDC’s e-learning platform (ILIAS LMS).

Attendance is mandatory for all course days. A certificate will be awarded to those course participants who have completed the full course, including the mandatory e-learning modules.

Location: The course will take place at the A. Borschette Conference Centre, Rue Froissart 36, 1046 Etterbeek, Brussels (Belgium).
