INVITATION TO THE COURSE

"THE EUROPEAN UNION FACING HYBRID THREATS"

(Activity Number 22-23/40/1)

Brussels, December 13-15, 2022

The French Institute for Higher National Defense Studies (IHEDN) has the honor to organize, within the European Security and Defence College (ESDC), a course entitled "The European Union facing hybrid threats". This course will be organized in Brussels, from December 13 to December 15, 2022.

The return of high-intensity warfare in Europe, with the current war in Ukraine, underscores the recent transformation of the geopolitical but also strategic environment at the European level. In this context, countering hybrid threats, which can be generally described as the exploitation of vulnerabilities by state and non-state actors, remain one of the most complex and acute challenges the European Union and its Member States are facing.

Hybrid actions are characterized by their ambiguity, through the combination of conventional and unconventional means. Defined as transversal insofar as they can impact various domains at the same time, in a highly volatile security environment, characterized by an increased competition between state powers, hybrid threats call for adequate and robust responses at the European level.

From an EU point of view, the Strategic Compass, the first white paper and defence at the EU level, adopted in March 2022 and based on a joint analysis of the different threats and analysis the EU is facing, underlines the necessity to enhance the resilience of the Union through the detection, the prevention and the elaboration of coordinated responses, in close cooperation with partners and allies, particularly with NATO, to hybrid threats. In this perspective, the implementation of the Hybrid Toolbox and Response Teams which aim at fostering complementarity but also closer coordination between the different actors involved in detecting and responding to hybrid threats. The 2020 EU Security Union Strategy also insisted on the

importance of implementing an innovative approach in countering hybrid threats in order to preserve the security of the EU, of its institutions and of its citizens.

The course organized by the IHEDN is open to civil servants and military personnel from EU Member States and EU institutions, more specifically involved in defence and security issues and willing to update and deepen their knowledge on hybrid threats. Academics and members of the business community from all EU Member States can also be nominated in order to participate in this seminar. Selected attendees will, throughout this course, have the opportunity to benefit from the expertise of various representatives and specialists from EU Member States, from EU institutions but also from NATO.

This seminar will include an e-learning preparatory phase prior to the residential phase of the course which will take place in Brussels, from December 13 to December 15, 2022. It will be mandatory to attend both parts of the seminar (preparatory and residential parts). The working language during this seminar will be English. No translation will be provided.

It is therefore with great pleasure that we invite you to participate in this course. You will find below all details regarding the registration process.
