DIPLOMATIC SKILLS FOR CSDP

Activity Number 23-24/67/1

The Cyprus Security and Defence Academy of the Ministry of Defence of the Republic of Cyprus and the Diplomatic Academy of the University of Nicosia, under the aegis of the European Security and Defence College, have the honour of organising and inviting participants to the **Diplomatic Skills for CSDP Course**. This activity is organised with the support of the Cyprus Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Romanian Embassy in Cyprus. The course will take place in Larnaca, Cyprus, from 16 to 19 October 2023 (in a residential format).

The introductory course on Diplomacy for CSDP will focus on a general introduction to the issues involved, aiming to familiarise the participants with the basic principles in the area of diplomacy. It will also cover the international strategic and diplomatic context, and do a critical assessment of the connections between diplomacy and the CSDP/CFSP domain. Further, it will discuss 'new' and 'old' diplomacy, globalisation trends, and the relevance of public diplomacy in the context of CSDP missions, as well as introduce concepts and practices related to digital/e-diplomacy. The ultimate goal of the Diplomatic Skills Course is to support EU Member States and EU institutions and agencies in training their personnel to work efficiently in CSDP-related fields at operational and strategic levels.

Participants would generally be entry / mid-level staff (police, military, diplomats & civilians) from Member States, EU institutions and agencies, and third countries / international organisations, with some experience in security policy matters.

We invite you to nominate suitable candidates for the Diplomatic Skills Course, which offers an excellent opportunity to contribute to achieving the overall objective of the ESDC: providing Member States and EU bodies with knowledgeable personnel able to work in CSDP-related fields.

Administrative Information

-Diplomatic Skills for CSDP (Larnaca – Cyprus, 16-19.10.2023)-

- **Target group:** The course is open to civilian (incl. diplomatic), police and military personnel from the EU Member States, relevant EU institutions and agencies and CSDP Missions and Operations, together with selected personnel from the Eastern Partnership and MENA countries;
- **Places & nominations:** *A maximum of 35 places will be available for international participants (plus 15 places for EaP countries). Typically, one place per Member State will be allocated; however, depending on the total number of requests, an additional place could be provided. We seek for a balanced group composed of civilians, police and military personnel.*
- **Application should be submitted **no later than 25 September 2023**, as follows:**
 - Designated nominators should nominate candidates from EU Member States, EU institutions and agencies through the secure internet system ENLIST. A list with relevant ENLIST nominators can be retrieved from the ESDC website at <https://esdc.europa.eu/nominators/>.
 - The competent authority should send participants' applications from international organisations and third countries, other than the Eastern Partnership countries, directly to the ESDC Secretariat (secretariat-esdc@eeas.europa.eu), CC to Georgica.PANFIL@eeas.europa.eu and to szambas@mod.gov.cy, mentioning the name, organisation, function, personal email address and motivation to follow the course.
 - Eastern Partnership countries should send their nominations (*up to 5 participants each, preferably representatives of ministries of the interior, defence or foreign affairs, with priority given to experts from the law enforcement services, plus diplomats in charge of the CSDP/CFSP*) for the course to Georgica.PANFIL@eeas.europa.eu (mentioning name, function, institution, personal email address).
- **Attendance:** The participant's attendance during the course is **mandatory** on all days. The course participants, who will complete the entire course (including the e-Learning modules), will receive the ESDC certificate. The course is fully residential with no possibility for a hybrid format.
- **e-Learning:** A **mandatory e-Learning module (set to start on 29 September)** will precede the course and course participants will have to complete it before the residential phase in Larnaca, Cyprus.
- **Language:** The working language will be English, without translation.
- **Costs:** Sending authorities will have to pay for all international travel and accommodation costs (including breakfast).
- **Dress code:** Formal or service uniform for the opening and closing ceremonies; smart casual for the working sessions.



- **Liability and Insurance:** In case of medical emergencies, sending countries/organisations should cover the costs. The organiser does not provide health or accident insurance for participants participating in the event.
- **Start and end of activity:** The activity will start on Monday, 16.10. (09.00) and end on Thursday, 19.10. (17.00).
