Administrative Information

Target Group

The course is open for civilian, police and military staff from EU Member States, EU institutions and agencies, CSDP missions and operations as well as international organisations involved in CSDP context. Priority is given to the personnel, which is already selected to high-risk CSDP missions and operations. Third countries and international organisations are welcome to put forward suitable candidates.

Maximum number of participants: 14

Course Language: English

Attendance: The participant's attendance during the course is mandatory on all days. A certificate will be awarded to those participants who have completed the full course.

Travel Expenses, Accommodation, Course Fee and Per Diems:

The course does not bear any registration fee. Costs for travelling to/from Soave, accommodation (including breakfast), meals and local transports shall be covered by the participants.

Liabilities and Insurance: In case of medical emergencies, the costs should be covered by the participant's medical insurance provided by the sending country/organization. The organizer does not provide health or accident insurance for participants taking part in the event.

Arrival / Departure

Participants are invited to arrive in Soave on Sunday 16th April 2023. The course will start on Monday 17th April 2023 at 08:30 AM and will finish on Friday 21st April 2023 at 2 PM.

Mandatory e-learning

Please note that before attending the HEAT course, it is mandatory to complete the online courses on CSDP Missions Safety and Security: Mission-wise and Safe (links will be provided to selected participants). The certificates of both E-Learning lessons should be sent to the Course Director prior to the beginning of the course.

The selection of participants will be based upon applicant backgrounds, experience, suitability, gender balance and country of origin. The decision on which applications are accepted remains solely with ESDC and Fondazione SAFE.

Selected participants will be requested to submit within one week from the start of the course the following additional documents:

- Medical certificate confirming good health condition
- Psychological and physical well-being questionnaire filled in.
