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<u>1. Administrative Information</u>

Target Group

The course is open for civilian, police and military staff from EU Member States, EU institutions and agencies, CSDP missions and operations as well as international organisations involved in CSDP context. Priority is given to the personnel which has already been selected for high risk CSDP missions and operations. Third countries and international organisations are welcome to put forward suitable candidates.

Maximum number of participants: 14

Course Language: English

Attendance: The participant's attendance during the course is mandatory on all days. A certificate will be awarded to those participants who have completed the full course.

Travel Expenses, Accommodation, Course Fee and Per Diems:

The course does not bear any registration fee. Costs for travelling to/from Soave, accommodation (including breakfast), meals and local transport shall be covered by the participants.

Liabilities and Insurance: In case of medical emergencies, the costs should be covered by the participant's medical insurance provided by the sending country/organisation. The organiser does not provide health or accident insurance for participants taking part in the course.

Arrival / Departure

Participants are invited to arrive in Soave on Sunday 15 June 2025. The course will start on Monday 16 June 2025 at 08:30 AM and will finish on Friday 20 June 2025 at 2 PM.

How to apply and requirements:

Applicants should send the application form filled in and an up-to-date CV to <u>calvarina@safe-</u> <u>europe.eu</u> by **Monday 5 May 2025**. Please note that before attending the HEAT course, it is







mandatory to complete the online courses on CSDP Missions Safety and Security: Missionwise and Safe (link will be provided to selected participants). The certificates of both E-Learning lessons should be sent to the Course Director prior to the beginning of the course.

The selection of participants will be based upon applicant backgrounds, experience, suitability, gender balance and nationality. The decision on which applications are accepted remains solely with ESDC and Fondazione SAFE.

The ESDC is committed to an inclusive, gender-sensitive and discrimination-free environment. Only in an inclusive environment can all people, and therefore the ESDC and its partners, realise their true potential. We therefore particularly encourage those applicants who are likely to be underrepresented to apply.

Selected participants will be requested to submit within one week from the start of the course the following additional documents:
