The course provides a general overview on the civilian and military aspects of the CSDP. In particular, participants will find out about the CSDP institutional framework, current policies, as well as related structures and processes. Participants will have the opportunity to be part of a network of people working in the field of CSDP.

We would be pleased if you could nominate suitable candidates for this training activity, which would offer them an excellent opportunity to gain an insight into the CSDP and contribute to achieving the ultimate goal of the course: *providing Member States and EU institutions with knowledgeable personnel, able to work in CSDP related fields.*

Administrative instructions

- The course is open to both civilian and military personnel. The EU Member States, EU Institutions and Agencies and the CSDP Missions and Operations are kindly invited to nominate one participant each. Additional places may, however, be allocated subsequently, based on the total number of applications.
- Third countries and international organisations are invited to propose suitable candidates.
- The overall course capacity is 60 persons.
- Applications from the MS and EU institutions are to be filled via the ESDC secure internet system ENLIST, by designated nominators, no later than **16 April 2024**. A list with relevant ENLIST nominators can be found on the ESDC website.
- Applications from third countries and international organisations should be sent to the ESDC Secretariat at SECRETARIAT-ESDC@eeas.europa.eu, by the institution/organisation that receives this invitation. The application should indicate: full name of the candidate (as in official documents used for accessing a course venue), personal e-mail address (functional mailboxes will not be accepted), nationality, passport number, validity of passport, date of birth, institution; reason why this course will benefit the applicant.
- Registration will not be final until confirmed by the ESDC Secretariat AND upon completion of the requested personal data in ENLIST by the confirmed participants.
- The language regime of the CSDP - *English and French without translation* - applies.
- The course consists of an **eLearning** part, which is carried out on the ESDC eLearning platform ILIAS, as well as **face to face sessions** from **13 to 17 May 2024**; both parts are compulsory. Attendance of the course on all days is mandatory. A certificate will be awarded to those course participants who have completed the full course, including the eLearning phase.
- The course will start on **22 April 2024** with the **eLearning phase**. Connection details will be provided in due course to all registered participants.
- The face-to-face training course will take place from **13 to 17 May 2024 (Monday 09:00 to Friday 13:00)**.
- Location of the residential module: **Albert Borschette Conference Centre**, Rue Froissart 36, 1042, Brussels.
- **Dress code:** Formal dress or service uniform for the opening and closing days (including for the ‘family photo’), smart casual clothing for the rest of the course and for the ice-breaker.



- **Liabilities and Insurance:** In case of medical emergencies, the participant's medical insurance, provided by the sending country / organisation, should cover the related costs. The organiser does not provide health or accident insurance for participants.
- **Gender equality:** The European Security and Defence College (ESDC) is committed to an inclusive, gender sensitive and discrimination-free environment. The ESDC welcome applications from all suitably qualified candidates, irrespective of age, gender, ethnic or social origin, disability, religion or belief.
- **Costs:** The tuition is free of charge.

Sending authorities will bear all costs for their participant's international travel, transportation, accommodation and catering during the course. Participants should arrange their own travel, accommodation and meals. The course organisers will not provide transportation. Travel and accommodation arrangements should not be made before the reception of the message confirming the nominee's admission.
