Participants will complete online content at their own pace over a three-week period. (4 November to 24 November).

Following this, they will take part in four(4) highly interactive group sessions, designed to deepen their understanding of the material studied. These sessions will engage all participants in various activities and will be conducted over four (4) consecutive mornings. (25 to 28 November)
