





Invitation to the ESDC course:

Modern leadership in the context of the law of armed conflict and open-source intelligence

14-18 October 2024, Thessaloniki, Greece

Brussels, 17 June 2024

The Hellenic Army War College (HAWC) and the Cyprus Security and Defence Academy (CSDA), under the aegis of the European Security and Defence College (ESDC), have the honour of organising the course 'Modern leadership in the context of the law of armed conflict and open-source intelligence', from 14 to 18 October 2024, in Thessaloniki, Greece.

The course aims to help the participants to reach their full leadership potential in the context of armed conflict. Furthermore, the course aims to educate participants regarding the key elements of the law of armed conflict (LOAC) and the impact of open-source intelligence (OSINT) in decision-making. In addition, the course will provide participants with opportunities for networking and mindful conversation with peers and experts.

The course consists of an e-learning phase and a residential phase. During the e-learning phase, participants will be introduced to the basic principles of subjects that will be further analysed in the subsequent residential phase (14-18 October). The three basic modules on which the course focuses are leadership, LOAC and OSINT.

Subject matter experts and qualified tutors will guide participants through the course material, through lecturing, mentoring and discussion. In addition, all participants will have the opportunity to work in groups and put their new knowledge into practice, in workshops and a crisis management scenario.







The course is open to mid-/senior-ranking military/law enforcement officers and civilian staff, from various levels of governmental institutions (defence, foreign affairs, interior, etc.) of Member States and EU structures.

Personnel involved in planning or conducting military operations and personnel deployed or expected to be deployed in civilian/military CSDP missions/operations are also welcome.

The ESDC is committed to an inclusive, gender-sensitive and discrimination-free environment. Only in an inclusive environment can all people, including the ESDC and its partners, realise their true potential. Therefore, applicants who are likely to be underrepresented are particularly encouraged to apply.

Administrative instructions
