



Dear Applicant,

Under the auspices and in cooperation with the European Security and Defence College (ESDC) the Federal Police Academy will offer a Hostile Environment Awareness Training (HEAT) as follows:

Thursday 24th November to Friday 25th November 2022 – **Vehicle Safety and 4x4 Driving**
Monday 28th November to Friday 2nd December 2022 – **HEAT**

Both courses are linked to each other and will take place at the Federal Police Academy in Luebeck/ Germany. Enrolment in only one of the courses is subject to availability of seats, please enquire with the course administration.

The training will be carried out in close cooperation with the European Security and Defence College (ESDC) using the approved ESDC Curriculum for *Vehicle Safety and 4x4 Driving* and *Hostile Environment Awareness Training (HEAT)*. Course Aim (Vehicle Safety and 4x4 Driving Course)

This course familiarises and systemises the knowledge and practical skills in safe and effective usage of vehicles in remote areas without technical support, in difficult/ close to extreme driving conditions with various 4x4-vehicle settings, connecting the vehicle operator/ crew safety and operational effectiveness.

Course Aims (HEAT)

The course aims to contribute in sustaining front of mind security and situational awareness, reinforce a safety and security awareness mind-set, and develop confidence. In addition, to provide guidance on individual and team options to help **deter**, **detect** and **react** during and after threatening events thus increasing the overall personal safety and security of staff members while serving in Mission.

Course Content

- CSDP civilian mission Security Risk Management organisation and processes
- Personal Security Awareness
- Personal Security in practice
- Close Protection Teams
- Basic Navigation
- Field Communication
- Field Trip Planning
- Basic Life Support
- Mines and Explosives Awareness
- Guns and Weaponry Risks
- Checkpoints: legal and illegal
- Surviving Hostage and Kidnapping Situation
- Civil Unrest
- Field Trip Exercise

Target Group

The course is open for civilian, police and military staff from EU Member States, EU institutions and agencies, CSDP missions and operations as well as international organisations involved in CSDP context. Priority is given to the personnel, which is already selected to high risk CSDP missions and operations.

We aim to strike a gender balance, so applications from female participants are encouraged.

Maximum number of participants:16

Course Language: English

Travel Expenses, Accommodation, Course Fee and Per Diems:

The course does not bear any participation fee! Per Diems will not be paid.

The participants have to cover their own travel expenses, food (approx. 7 €/day if you wish to eat in the canteen of the Federal Police Academy) and accommodation (nearby hotel approx. 65-80 €/day including breakfast). Participants will be supported finding a suitable nearby hotel.

Only for State and Federal Police Officers from Germany:

Department 73 of the Federal Police will cover all costs. Accommodation will be booked by the Federal Police Academy.

Arrival / Departure

HEAT Participants should arrive on Wednesday, 23rd November 2022. The course will start on Thursday, 24th November 2022 at 07.30 AM and end on Friday 2nd December 2022 at 12 PM.

Participants can keep their rooms over the weekend.

How to apply and requirements:

Applicants should send the application form including a paragraph (max. 200 words) about why they wish to attend the course and an up-to-date CV.

It is mandatory to finish the online courses on CSDP Missions Safety and Security:

Mission-wise and Safe (the link will be provided to the selected participants)

The certificates of both E-Learning lessons should be sent to the Course Director prior to the beginning of the course.

The selection of participants will be based upon applicant backgrounds, experience, suitability, gender balance and nationality. The decision on which applications are accepted remains solely with the Federal Police Academy and ESDC.
