## Administrative Information

(Training Activity Number 23-24/PILOT/6)

- Target Group: the course is open to both civilian and military (mid-level) personnel from EU Member States, relevant EU institutions and agencies, and CSDP missions and operations, who either are or will be involved in work on Common Security and Defence Policy (CSDP) matters. Candidates should have a special interest in financial and economic issues. The course is particularly intended for personnel working at the interface of security, defence and external relations (including trade, investment and enlargement).
- Nomination: all EU Member States, institutions and agencies may nominate one (1) participant each. The total number of participants is limited to 25 persons.
- Application: applications from the EU Member States, institutions and agencies are to be submitted by designated nominators via the ESDC secure internet system, ENLIST, at <u>https://esdc.europa.eu/enlist/login</u>. A list of the relevant ENLIST nominators can be found on the ESDC website at <u>https://esdc.europa.eu/nominators/</u>.
- Registration & deadline: the registration period will end on 5 October 2023. Registration will
  not be final until it is confirmed by the ESDC Secretariat <u>AND</u> the ENLIST registration form has
  been completed by the nominated participant.
- Language: the working languages will be English and French, without interpretation.
- Attendance: attendance during the course is mandatory on all days. A certificate will be awarded on the last day to course participants who have completed the full course.
- Course venue: the course will take place at the Club Prince Albert (Rue des Petits Carmes/Karmelietenstraat 20, 1000 Brussels, Belgium; <u>https://sites.google.com/view/prinsalbertclub/homepage</u>, Tel: +32 2 2680595).
- **Costs:** all costs relating to travel and accommodation (including breakfasts, lunches and one dinner) are to be covered by the sending authorities.









- Hotel: you have to make your own booking in a hotel of your choice.
- Meals: on Monday evening, there will be an ice-breaker, and on Wednesday evening, there will be a farewell dinner. Coffee breaks will be hosted by the ESDC. For lunches, please find an individual option in the vicinity of the course venue.
- **Dress code:** for military: day uniform with jacket and tie; for civilians: business casual. For the photo and the presentation of certificates: business suit.
