Invitation to the Common Security and Defence Policy Orientation Course

(Activity Number 23-24/3/4)

Sofia, 23-27 October 2023

The Bulgarian Diplomatic Institute to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Bulgaria and the European Security and Defence College (ESDC) have the honour to co-organise the Common Security and Defence Policy (CSDP) Orientation Course, which will be held in Sofia, Bulgaria, from 23 to 27 October 2023. A special focus of this course will be on the challenges posed by Russia's unprovoked and unjustified war of aggression against Ukraine for the European security architecture.

The CSDP Orientation Course is a major component of the ESDC's training activities. It aims to develop and promote a better understanding of CSDP as an integral part of the Common Foreign and Security Policy (CFSP) of the European Union. It will provide participants with an overview of the civilian and military aspects of the CSDP, going into more detail as the course progresses.

The course consists of an eLearning part, as well as a residential session held in Sofia; both parts are compulsory. A certificate will be awarded to those participants who have successfully completed the full course.

The ESDC is committed to an inclusive, gender-sensitive and discrimination-free environment. Only in an inclusive environment can all people, and hence the ESDC and its partners, realise their true potential. For that reason, we particularly encourage those applicants who are likely to be underrepresented to apply.

Hence, we would like to **invite you to nominate suitable candidates for the CSDP Orientation Course** and thereby support the overarching goal: providing Member States and EU institutions with knowledgeable personnel, able to work in CSDP-related fields.

Administrative instructions:

Target group: the course is open to both civilian and military personnel, including police and diplomatic staff. EU institutions and agencies, Member States and the CSDP missions and operations are kindly invited to nominate one candidate each. However, more places could be allocated, based on the total number of applications. Third countries and international organisations are also welcome to put forward candidates.
The European Security and Defence College (ESDC) aims for an inclusive, gender-sensitive and discrimination-free environment in all its courses, activities and day-to-day work. Only in an inclusive environment can all people, and therefore the ESDC and its partners, reach their true potential. We do not and will not discriminate on the basis of race, colour, religion, gender, gender expression, age, national origin, disability, marital status, or sexual orientation in any of our activities or operations. The ESDC and the training institutions will not tolerate any conduct that violates these values.
Places and nominations: there is a maximum of 35 places on the course. Typically, one place per Member State and one per applying third country or international organisation will be allocated. However, depending on the total number of requests, additional places could be offered.
Application: designated nominators have to complete the <u>application forms</u> via the ESDC secure internet system ENLIST by 29 September 2023 . The list of <u>designated nominators</u> is available on the ESDC website. Registration will not be final until confirmed by the ESDC Secretariat and upon completion of the registration by the nominated participant. Further detailed information on the course will be sent by email to the course participants as soon as the list of participants is complete.

The application should indicate: full name; personal email address (functional mailboxes will not be accepted); nationality; passport number; passport expiry date; date of birth; institution; a brief explanation of how this course would benefit the applicant.

applicants have filled in the registered participants' information in ENLIST.
Language: the language regime is English without translation.
eLearning and residential part of the course: the course consists of two sections – an eLearning part to be carried out on the ESDC eLearning platform ILIAS, set to start on 3 October 2023 , to be finalised before the residential phase held in Sofia, Bulgaria, from 23 to 27 October 2023. Information on the course venue will be provided in due course to all confirmed participants. Both parts of the course are compulsory. Participants must attend the entire (i.e. all days) residential phase of the course.
A certificate will be awarded to those course participants who have completed the full course, including the eLearning part of the course.
Costs: the sending country/authority/organisation must cover all costs for international travel, accommodation and meals during the residential part of the course.
Liability and insurance: in the event of medical emergencies, the participant's medical insurance provided by the sending country/authority/organisation must cover all the costs. The course organisers do not provide personal health or accident insurance for this course.
