SECURITY IN THE BLACK SEA REGION. SHARED CHALLENGES, SUSTAINABLE FUTURE. EUROPE AND ITS NEIGHBOURHOOD

The Mihai Viteazul National Intelligence Academy, under the aegis of the European Security and Defence College and with the support of the Directorate-General for Neighbourhood and Enlargement Negotiations, has the honour of organising and inviting participants to the course entitled 'Security in the Black Sea region. Shared challenges, sustainable future. Europe and its neighbourhood', to be held in Bucharest, Romania, from 22 to 26 May 2023 (in a residential format).

The course will feature five days of lectures, debates and interactive exercises on the topic of the challenges faced by the Black Sea region and the policy responses which supra-national, national and regional decision-makers can adopt in order to combat them. The format provides the opportunity for young and senior leaders in EU Member States and Eastern Partnership (EaP) countries to meet, share ideas and debate on how to build secure societies in the future. The programme aims to foster cooperation in the region, increase state and societal resilience and to contribute to the development of a common strategic culture between Member States and EaP countries.

Participants would generally be entry/mid-level staff (military, diplomatic, police, intelligence and civilians) from Member States and EaP countries with some experience in security policy matters.

The ESDC is committed to an inclusive, gender-sensitive and anti-discriminatory environment. Only in an inclusive environment can all people, and therefore the ESDC and its partners, reach their true potential. We therefore particularly encourage applicants who are likely to be under-represented to apply.

We invite you to nominate participants for the course entitled 'Security in the Black Sea region. Shared challenges, sustainable future. Europe and its neighbourhood', which offers an excellent opportunity to contribute to achieving the ultimate goal of the ESDC: providing Member States and EaP countries with knowledgeable personnel able to address common policy challenges.

- **Target group:** the course is open to civilian and military personnel from EU Member States and Eastern Partnership (EaP) countries who are invited to nominate suitable participants with expertise in security, intelligence and/or diplomacy.
- Places and nominations: around 35 places will be available for EU Member States and EU Institutions (plus 22 places for EaP countries). Typically, one or two places per Member State will be allocated however, depending on the total number of requests, one additional place could be provided. We are seeking to put together a balanced group composed of civilians, police, intelligence and military personnel.
- Applications should be sent by 20 April 2023, as follows:
- Applications from the Member States must be filed via the ESDC secure internet system ENLIST, by designated nominators, under <u>https://esdc.europa.eu/enlist/login.</u> A list with relevant ENLIST nominators can be found on the ESDC website at <u>https://esdc.europa.eu/nominators/</u>.
- Eastern Partnership countries must send their nominations (up to five participants each, preferably representatives of ministries of the interior, defence or foreign affairs, and prioritising experts from law enforcement services and intelligence services) for the course to <u>Georgica.PANFIL@eeas.europa.eu</u> (mentioning name, function, institution, and personal email address).
- Attendance: participants' attendance on all days of the course is **mandatory**. A certificate will be awarded on the last day to those course participants who have completed the entire course, including the e-Learning modules. This course will not be offered in a hybrid format.
- Language: the working language is English, without interpretation.
- **Costs:** international travel and accommodation costs (including breakfast) must be covered by the sending authorities for representatives of EU Member States. Representatives of EaP countries will have their travel, accommodation and per diem expenses covered by the EU Commission's DG NEAR.
- **Gender equality:** the ESDC strives for a gender-sensitive and inclusive environment in all its courses, activities and day-to-day work. Only in an inclusive environment can all people, and therefore the ESDC and its partners, reach their true potential. We do not and will not discriminate on the basis of race, colour, religion, gender, gender expression, age, national origin, disability, marital status, or sexual orientation in any of our activities or operations. The ESDC and the training institutions will not tolerate any conduct that violates these values.
